## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### While we are all winding down the

first quarter of 2020, there are two important things that I wanted to remind everyone about—Primary runoff elections and the 2020 U.S. Census. Both are very important to rural Texas and electric cooperatives.

We have just wrapped up primary voting on March 3rd, but for some, this means just the "first" election is over. You may have local candidates in run-off elections and even federal and state office candidates who are still working to get across the finish line in the primary. The run-off day will be May 26th with early voting starting one week prior.

Also easily forgotten, your municipal elections and local school boards could have a slate of candidates for a May 2nd Election. Please take the time to find out! Historically, these are very low turnout races. It would be good to see that change in 2020. Your voice in your city and your school is through your elected representatives.

We have a tremendous organization and network to impact all levels of government if we will just jump in and take part. Please get involved, get educated and encourage others.

Second, like elections, it is important to take part in the census. You likely have already received notices in the mail and there has been a concerted effort this year across the state to get the word out more than ever.

If you did not already know, the census is constitutionally required. The constitution mandates that everyone in the

country be counted every 10 years. It is important for many reasons, but for starters, the reapportioning of the US House of Representatives depends on it. You may recall that in 2010, Texas gained additional seats in Congress. That stands to be the case again in 2020 if we make sure every person living in Texas is counted. The population data will also impact the drawing of local political lines in our counties and for our state house and senate seats.

The Census data is also available for use by business developers and local governments. The data is used in the distribution of about \$675 billion in federal funds, grants and money to states, counties and communities. But not to worry, your personal information is safe and is protected by law. Your personal information cannot be used by any other agency.

This is the first year that you can fill out census information online if you so choose. Instructions will come to every house so be on the lookout. They would like for you have it back in by the end of April, and doing so will likely help ease the burden on census workers who will be visiting people who do not respond. There is a lot more of information available at census.gov. Let's help educate our community because the impact will be felt for at least the next decade.

2020 is a big year and we've just gotten started! Let's make a difference!

It operates under a set of bylaws and the policies of a board of directors composed of electric co-op leaders elected from around the state. ACRE - the Action Committee for Rural Electrification - supports candidates for the U.S. Congress. Rural Friends and ACRE are subject to all state and federal campaign finance laws and reporting requirements.

**Membership** is strictly voluntary and consists of persons who have an interest in preserving and defending our local electric co-ops. Rural Friends/ACRE raises personal, voluntary contributions from supporters who care about our co-ops and the communities we serve.

**Contributions** go to candidates for state and federal office who have demonstrated support for electric co-op goals, who share co-op values and who want electric co-ops to be successful. Support is based on voting records on legislation affecting electric co-ops, statements on co-op issues, and historical stances on those issues.
